



LAWS OF PASSOVER ON SHABBAT

Thursday

- * Taanit Bechorot (starts at 4:25, ends at 18:15).
- * Bedikat Chametz starting at 18:15. At the end of Bedikat Chametz – Bitul Chametz, as we do every year.
- * Leave Challah for Shabbat and set it aside.
- * Don't forget to switch the clock to Daylight saving time. At 2:00 move your clock one hour forward to 3:00.
- * Don't forget to sell your Chametz.

Friday

- * Burning the Chametz, not including Challah for Shabbat, without Bitul Chametz after, until 11:40.
- * Prepare all that is needed for Shabbat and the Seder (including roasting of the chicken, boiling the egg, preparing Maror etc.). Best to prepare a Kosher-for-Passover Shabbat, except for the Challah.
- * Lighting candles 18:38, sunset 18:58.
- * At candle lighting, add a Yahrzeit candle that will last until the end of Shabbat in order to light the Chag candles right at Motza'ei Shabbat. Best to prepare candles also for the Chag. If they weren't prepared ahead of time, you can prepare them after Shabbat without melting the candles.
- * Best to eat the Challah not on the Kosher-for-passover table but in a different room that is not meant for eating during Passover. When you finish eating the Challah, clean your hands and clothes and go back to your Shabbat table to dine.

Shabbat Hagadol (Saturday)

- * Dovening will begin earlier than usual in order to have enough time to eat Chametz. Shacharit will begin at 7:00 at the GMC shul.
- * You're not allowed to eat Matza during Shabbat.
- * Last time for eating Chametz: 10:10.
- * After eating the Chametz, collect all the crumbs that are left and throw them into the toilet. If you have a lot of Chametz left, you can use bleach to dispose it. Disposal of Chametz before 11:25.
- * After the meal, brush your teeth.
- * Seudah shlishit without Hamotzi (you can eat meat, fruits, etc.). You should dine earlier than usual in order to have an appetite for the Seder.
- * The Seder table should be set right at Motza'ei Shabbat and not during Shabbat.

Motza'ei Shabbat

- * At Motza'ei Shabbat women should say "Hamavdil Ben Kodesh LeKodesh" and light the Chag candles from the Yahrzeit candle.
- * In Ma'ariv we add "Vatodienu".
- * Set the Seder table.
- * Kiddush blessings are as follows: Wine, Kiddush, candle, Havdallah and time (as written in the Siddur).
